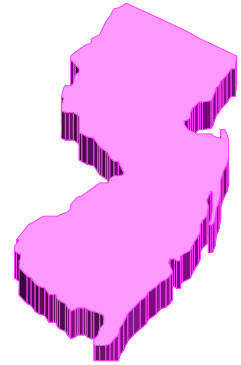
New Jersey has a population of 8.4 million, which is an 8.9 percent jump from 1990 to 2000. It is the most densely populated state in the country.

1.3 million people are uninsured.  
FQHCs serve approximately 436,000 individuals.

Currently 20 FQHCs operate 103 health center sites (76 primary sites, 16 school based sites, 8 mobile units) in 20 counties.

From 2002 to 2011, the following was planned:

- \* 38 new or expanded sites
- \* Expansion of hours or days at 10 existing FQHCs
- \* Employment opportunities for 354 new staff
- \* Services provided to 263,442 more patients
- \* Numerous service expansions such as mental health, dental, pharmacy
- \* Special population expansions
