## **January Cervical Health Awareness Month**

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January is Cervical Health Awareness Month, and the Jewish Renaissance Medical Center wants you to know that there's a lot you can do to prevent cervical cancer.

HPV (human papillomavirus) is the most common sexually transmitted disease. It's also a major cause of cervical cancer. About 79 million Americans currently have HPV, but many people with HPV don't know they are infected.

### **Good News:**

- HPV can be prevented by the HPV vaccine.
- Cervical cancer can often be prevented with regular screening tests (called Pap tests) and follow-up care.

### **In honor of National Cervical Health Awareness Month, the Jewish Renaissance Medical Center encourages:**

- Women to start getting regular Pap tests at age 21
- Women to get the HPV vaccine before age 27

- Parents to make sure their pre-teens get the HPV vaccine at age 11 or 12
- Men to get the HPV vaccine if you are under age 22
